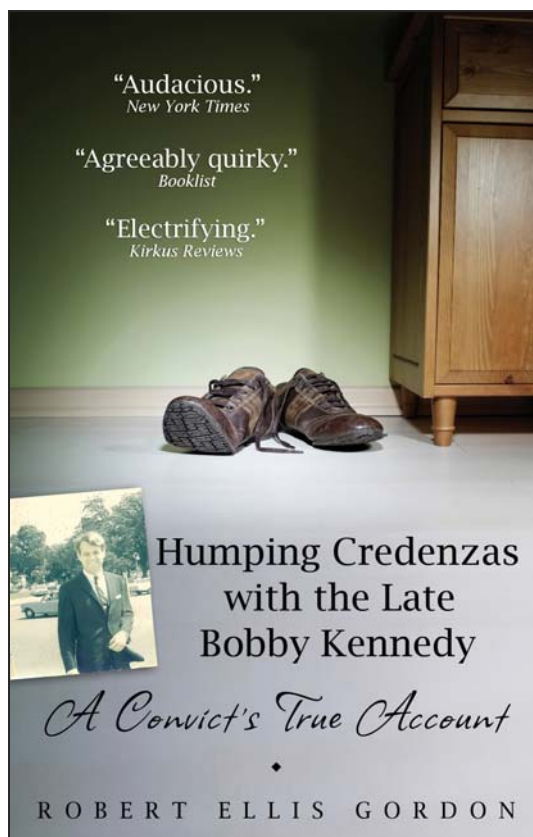

Robert Ellis Gordon, the five-time awarding-winning author of *The Funhouse Mirror: Reflections on Prison* (2001), has written for *Esquire*, the *Christian Science Monitor*, *Boston Globe*, *Ploughshares*, *Seattle Post-Intelligencer*, and *Huffington Post*. He is a Harvard Alumni who taught writing in Washington State to prison inmates, juvenile institutions and inner-city high schools. He wrote *Funhouse Mirror* while undergoing chemotherapy, collaborating with six of his incarcerated students to let their voices be heard. The book won the 2000 Washington State Book Award. Diagnosed with Lupus in 1998, Gordon has been in and out of remission, yet is now under hospice care.
